Anniversary as a charity!

Oakleaf became a registered charity on 22nd September 1997 and has been helping the community manage its mental ill-health ever since; having started with

just 40 clients, we now support over 800 people each year.

ANNIVERSARY

The last two years have transformed Oakleaf. As a result of the pandemic, in 2020 we moved to a blended model of delivery, providing support both in-person and online. In 2021 we began a 'Pathways to Work' employment project for clients, helping them to secure the skills, confidence and training needed to return to the workplace; we created a brand-new social enterprise 'Oakleaf At Home'; and we launched a Young Adult Safe Haven pilot.

To all those who have given their support over the last 25 years and to those who continue to do so - thank you. We simply could not expand and deliver our services without this support. We are continuing to offer work-related training, employment support, wellbeing activities, one-to-one emotional support and counselling services both online and in-person, so that every one of our clients has access to the support they need.

The theme for International Women's Day 2022 was #BreakTheBias, so we wanted to celebrate the achievements of women in the workplace by shining a spotlight on two brilliant individuals: Toni and Chloe, Oakleaf's Social Enterprise Assistants. Not only have they been pivotal in the creation of our new social enterprise 'Oakleaf At Home', they are also talented artists and upholsterers responsible for the beautiful designs behind it.

TONI: "Anxiety and depression has always been present in my life. I was first introduced to Oakleaf as a client in 2014 and immediately felt safe among like-minded people. Oakleaf's Upholstery course gave me a focus, a routine and slowly I gained confidence, which made it possible to return to work."

Unfortunately, in 2020 Toni's anxiety and panic attacks returned. So, she decided to reach out to Oakleaf once more for support.

"Art has always been very cathartic and rewarding to me so when Oakleaf announced an art competition I duly entered."

Toni was one of two successful participants, which meant her artwork would be used for Oakleaf At Home.

"I was anxious about not working to a high enough standard but with the right support, Oakleaf allowed me to really flourish in my role."

CHLOE: "In 2015 I learned how to paint with watercolours to a professional standard. I did so through Oakleaf Enterprise's art classes. I then started an upholstery training course in 2017 where I got to hone in on my design skills."

When Chloe became a client at Oakleaf, she was working through feelings of not being good enough. However, Chloe was eventually able to overcome her imposter syndrome by stepping out of her comfort zone; volunteering at work events, attending meet-and-greets, and raising awareness of mental ill-health.

"I have really grown in confidence under the caring guidance of Oakleaf. I have learned how to run a small business and it has felt wonderful to be creative again. My goal now, is to become financially independent through setting up my own furniture design and upholstery

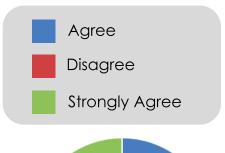

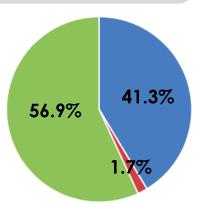


CLIENT SATISFACTION SURVEY

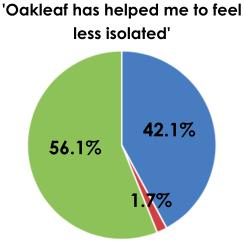
We conducted a Client Satisfaction Survey in January 2022 seeking feedback from our clients. It was great to see the positive impact Oakleaf has had.

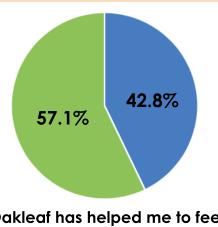

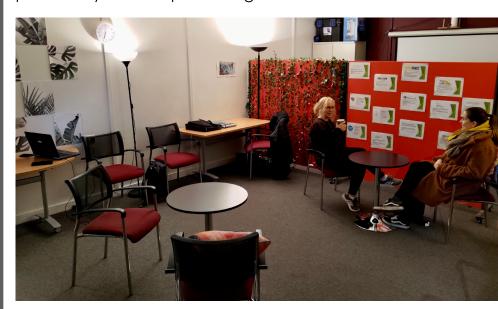

YOUNG ADULT SAFE HAVEN

We are continuing to run, in partnership with Catalyst, a new pilot Young Adult Safe Haven service in Guildford from November 2021 through November 2022 - a safe space for 18-25 year olds who are facing mental health challenges and are in need of emotional support, particularly those experiencing distress out-of-hours.



The Safe Haven is situated at Oakleaf's Walnut Tree Close premises and is open to all between 5-9pm daily, 7 days a week - no appointment needed. The original Guildford Safe Haven also remains open at Oakleaf

365 nights a year from 6-11pm for

anyone in crisis.

Our experienced Young Adult Safe Haven Support Workers shine a light on the support they can offer:

"Some people may be arriving with stresses and worries about

exams, feelings of loneliness; they may

have had a recent bereavement or maybe a breakup from a relationship or a friendship breakdown, and we're here to support you through that and guide you through that process."

"We are here to support you and we understand that approaching mental health support can be

challenging. It might be out of your depth or comfort zone, but here, it's a safe space. We understand where you're coming from and we aim to make you comfortable and okay with what you're going through."

Our beautiful range of products include greeting cards, tea towels, oven gloves, wash bags and handmade cushions - every piece is crafted using original artwork, by Oakleaf clients.

By shopping our exclusive range of home accessories and gifts, you are helping to allow us to provide training and employment opportunities for Oakleaf clients as well as fund vital mental health and wellbeing support.

For example, £100 towards our counselling bursary could fund 10 weeks of counselling for two clients.
